

Printing a copy of the output of one of the Population Models

If you try and print a web page that contains a Java Applet (i.e. one of the interactive programs in the web pages) directly you find that the area of the program is left blank. In order to print or save a picture of one of these you have to capture the image some how. One method of doing this using the machines in our computer laboratories is to use "Paint Shop Pro". To do this You must

- Start "Paint Shop Pro". It is in the menu under "Programs", "Graphics and Presentations".
- Set up a "Hot Key" in "Paint Shop Pro": Pull down the "Capture" menu and select "Hot Key Setup ...". Select whatever key you want, say F11, and accept this.
- Pull down the "Capture" menu and select "Window". Move the cursor over the window with the population model running and press whatever "Hot Key" you selected.
- You should now have a copy of the image in "Paint Shop Pro". You can now save it or print it. You may also want to modify it by, say, cropping off the frame. Or tell "Paint Shop Pro" to reduce the number of colours in the palette. This can greatly reduce the size of the image.
